TOWN MANAGER REPORT

December 8, 2021

Since the last report on 11/18/21:

Notable Events:

- Town Counsel is in the process of approving our language for job descriptions for Public Safety Dispatcher, Patrol Officer, Sergeant and Lieutenant.
- A format that allows for initial and then annual review of employees has been adopted by Chief Ziemba who will soon start employee reviews.
- We continue to institute new policies.
- The DOJ group is moving along having chosen a date in March and a location to host the meeting. Next steps are approving a draft invite to the public, ensuring all people have a voice should they choose to, and finding 25 facilitators that will be trained by the DOJ to help lead the small group discussions.
- This week Chief Ziemba and Officer Sacco participated in a two day training for the new Northern Berkshire Hub Initiative which is being organized by the Northern Berkshire Community Coalition. The Hub model brings together many service providers from different areas of expertise to meet (initially) once a week to discuss cases and specific needs in the northern communities. Once identified, the service workers will offer resources to these persons so they don't slip through the cracks. Homelessness, Substance and Alcohol Abuse and Mental Health concerns will most likely be the primary issues faced locally.
- On 12/4 a truck from Holland Company in Adams, MA began to have a leak of Aluminum Sulfate that left residue on roadways from North Adams, through Williamstown, and into Pownal where the driver discovered the issue. Multiple jurisdictions worked to identify the locations and treatments needed, and assisted with the leak at the vehicle itself.
